BY-LAW NO. 12-2004

BEING A BY-LAW TO AMEND BY-LAW 14-2003, A BY-LAW TO DESIGNATE THE PROPERTY KNOWN MUNICIPALLY AS PART OF LOT 14, SURVEY TEETZEL 22 CONCESSION 2 NS (TRAFALGAR), PART 1 ON PLAN 20R-14863 IN THE TOWN OF MILTON AS BEING OF CULTURAL HERITAGE VALUE OR INTEREST (BRONTE PIONEER CEMETERY)

WHEREAS Part IV of The Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter 0.18, as amended, authorizes the Council of a municipality to enact a by-law to designate real property including all buildings and structures thereon, to be of cultural heritage value or interest:

AND WHEREAS the Council for the Corporation of the Town of Milton has caused to be served on the owners of the lands and premises known as, Part of Lot 14, Teetzel Survey, in the Town of Milton and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation, Notice of Intention to so designate the aforesaid real property and has caused such Notice of Intention to be published in the same newspaper having general circulation in the municipality;

AND WHEREAS the Council for the Corporation of the Town of Milton passed Bylaw 14-2003 on January 27, 2003 designating the Bronte Pioneer Cemetery as being of cultural heritage value or interest;

AND WHEREAS the Council for the Corporation of the Town of Milton desires to amend Schedules A and B to By-law 14-2003;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Milton hereby enacts as follows:

- THAT Schedules A And B to By-law 14-2003 be replaced by Schedules A 1. and B attached hereto;
- THAT all other provisions of By-law 14-2003 remain in force and effect; 2.

READ a FIRST, SECOND and THIRD TIME and FINALLY PASSED this 23rd day

of February, 2004.

SCHEDULE 'A' to BY-LAW NO. 12-2004

ALL AND SINGULAR that certain parcel or tract of land and premises situate, lying and being on the east side of Bronte Street, in the Town of Milton, Regional Municipality of Halton more particularly described as Part of Lot 14, Teetzel's Survey, Concession 2 NS, Former Geographic Township of Trafalgar, Part 1 on Plan 20R-14863 in the Town of Milton, Regional Municipality of Halton.

SCHEDULE 'B' to BY-LAW NO. 12-2004

The cemetery was established on Bronte Street as early as 1824. The first known burial in the cemetery occurred in July 1824, with the death of Thomas Harrison. Many of the area's early families are buried here, including Jasper (1833) and Sarah Martin (1830) who settled in Milton in 1820. Jasper built the first mill around which the community grew and this cemetery is located on Martin Crown Land.

Jasper Martin obtained title to the Southwest Half of Lot 14, Concession 2 NS Trafalgar by Crown Patent on March 24, 1826. These lands include the lands upon which the Bronte Pioneer Cemetery is now located.

There were 61 plots in the cemetery plan, separated by a pedestrian walk in the shape of an X. Dimensions of the plots were measured on the original plan by Henry Winter and Abrey, Surveyors, dated November 7, 1860.

The cemetery has a triangular shape with an iron fence that was erected in 1928. The two dozen erect stones, arches, pillars and high-rising pedestals that mark the last resting place of early Miltonians were re-set on new foundations in 2000. There are no known plot plans of the cemetery indicating the exact location of interments, however, markers in place in 1981 were recorded by the Ontario Genealogical Society.
