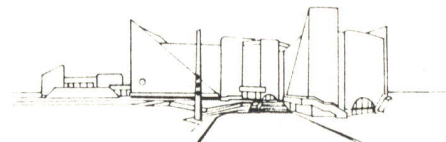



THE CORPORATION OF THE

BY-LAW NUMBER 21029

to designate Centennial Public Library  
at 115 St. Andrews Road as being of  
historical and architectural value.

---

WHEREAS the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1980, Chapter 337, authorizes the Council of a municipality to enact by-laws to designate a real property, including all the buildings and structures thereon, to be of historic or architectural value or interest;

AND WHEREAS the Council of The Corporation of the City of Scarborough has caused to be served upon the owners of the lands and premises known as Centennial Public Library at 115 St. Andrews Road and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation notice of intention to so designate the aforesaid real property and has caused such notice of intention to be published in a newspaper having a general circulation in the municipality once for each of three consecutive weeks;

AND WHEREAS the reasons for designation are set out in Schedule "B" hereto;

AND WHEREAS no notice of objection to the said proposed designation has been served upon the Clerk of the municipality;

THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF SCARBOROUGH ENACTS AS FOLLOWS;

1. That there is designated as being of architectural value or interest the real property more particularly described in Schedule "A" hereto, known as the Centennial Public Library at 115 St. Andrews Road.

2. That the City Solicitor is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be registered against the property described in Schedule "A" hereto in the proper land registry office.

3. That the City Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be served upon the owner of the aforesaid property and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation and to cause notice of this by-law to be published in a newspaper having general circulation in the City of Scarborough.

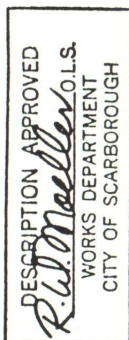
SCHEDULE "A" TO BY-LAW 21029

DESCRIPTION OF LAND



In the City of Scarborough in the Municipality of Metropolitan  
Toronto and being composed of that part of Lot 23 in the  
geographic Township of Scarborough in the County of York designated  
as PART 3 on a reference plan deposited in the Land Registry  
Office for the Registry Division of Toronto Boroughs (No.64)  
as plan 64R-10472.

SCHEDULE "B"

REASONS FOR THE DESIGNATION OF "CENTENNIAL

PUBLIC LIBRARY" AT 115 ST. ANDREWS ROAD

This building is of historic significance as it was erected in 1896 as a centennial project by the citizens of Scarborough, commemorating the 100th anniversary of the first white settlers to homestead in Scarborough.
