



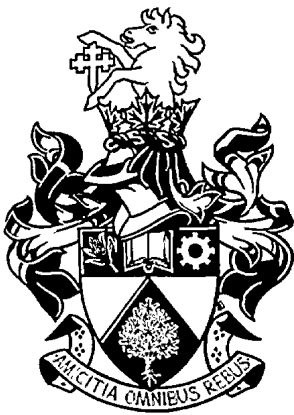

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE



TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Ridgetown intends to designate the properties, including lands and buildings, at the following municipal addresses as properties of architectural and/or historical value or interest under Part IV of The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, S. O. Chapter 122

- (a) Property Address - 59 Main Street East, Presbyterian Church
Reasons for the Proposed Designation - Built in 1879 on land donated by Ebenezer Colby, who was one of Ridgetown's first settlers. It was designed by the Architect W. G. Malcomson and built at a cost of about \$16,000. This Church is one of the most imposing landmarks in the Town and it's preservation is considered to be very desirable. Portion to be designated: The Exterior Facade.
- (b) Property Address - 19 West Street, Mr. & Mrs. Rudy Brown's home
Reasons for the Proposed Designation - This home was built by Zenas Watson who owned and subdivided most of Ward 1. His father was granted 100 acres in 1823. The house is one of the best examples of the late Victorian opulent homes which were favoured by the well-to-do of that period. Portion to be designated: The Exterior Facade.
- (c) Property Address - 26 George Street, St. Michael's Church
Reasons for the Proposed Designation - This Church was designed by the Architect W. C. Malcomson, and is one of the finest examples of his work. It has been the place of worship of the Roman Catholic members of our community since 1881, and is in excellent state of preservation. It is a fine example of the best of Ridgetown's early days. Portion to be designated - The Exterior Facade.

Notice of objection to the proposed designation, together with a statement of the reasons for the objection and all relevant facts may be served on the Clerk of the Town of Ridgetown before the 5th day of August, 1983.
