CORPORATION OF THE VILLAGE OF THAMESVILLE

BY-LAW NO. 874-79 3650 380001 45900

A BY-LAW TO DESIGNATE THE PROPERTY KNOWN  
MUNICIPALLY AS THE THAMESVILLE TOWN HALL,  
AS BEING OF ARCHITECTURAL AND HISTORICAL  
VALUE OR INTEREST.

WHEREAS section 29 of The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974 authorizes the Council of a municipality to enact by-laws to designate real property, including all buildings and structures thereon, to be of historical and architectural value or interest; and

WHEREAS the Council of the Corporation of the Village of Thamesville has caused to be served upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation, notice of intention to so designate the aforesaid real property and has caused such notice of intention to be published in the Thamesville Herald, a newspaper having general circulation in the municipality for three consecutive weeks; and

WHEREAS no notice of objection to the proposed designation has been served on the Clerk of the municipality;

THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the Village of Thamesville enacts as follows:

- 1) There is designated as being of historical and architectural value or interest the real property known as the Thamesville Town Hall more particularly described in Schedule "A" attached hereto. The municipal Solicitor and Clerk are hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be registered against the property described in Schedule "A" hereto in the Land Registry Office for the County of Kent.
- 2) The Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be served upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation and to cause notice of the passage of this by-law to be published in the Thamesville Herald in the municipality once for each of three consecutive weeks.
