





NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Orillia intends to designate the property municipally known as 50 Andrew Street South in the City of Orillia in the Province of Ontario as property of architectural and/or historical value or interest under Part IV of the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter O.18:

Reasons for the Proposed Designation

The Tudhope Building is historically significant for its housing of the most successful industry of Orillia's golden era. For almost a century, the Tudhope family built carriages, farm equipment, automobiles and later appliances at this location.

The three-storey red-brick building was erected in 1909. After a devastating fire destroyed the original Tudhope Carriage Company factory, Orillia largest employer, the new plant with modern assembly lines was completed in just 79 days.

Notice of Objection to the proposed designation, together with a statement of the reasons for the objection and all relevant facts may be served on the Clerk of the City of Orillia before the 25th day of February, 2001.
