NOTICE OF INTENTION

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Municipality of Grey Highlands intends to designate the following municipal address as being of historic and architectural significance under Part IV of the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 190, Chapter 0.18

Heritage Designation for Sykes Cottage on Part of lots 31, Concession 14 Municipality of Grey Highlands, Formerly Township of Osprey

Historically, the house was built in 1860 by Edmund Sykes who operated a saw mill on Lot 31 Concession 14 in the Township of Osprey being the property on which the house is located. The saw mill was in operation for approximately 80 years and used both steam and water power. The mill was one of numerous wood mills operating in the area, most of which had ceased operations about 30 years ago. It is believed that the house was built with lumber milled on the property. The mill operation and Edmund Sykes are referred to in the text called Peace, Plenty and Progress, a History of Osprey Township.

Architecturally, the Sykes cottage is significant in that it is representative of farm houses built in that era. The home has an area of approximately 112 square meters.

Exterior Features: All building elevations including the original exterior stucco.

<u>Interior Features:</u> Primary staircase, original wood trim, original wood floors, original wall, and all the original windows

Any person may send by registered Mail or deliver to the Deputy Clerk of the Municipality of Grey Highlands, Notice of his or her objections to the proposed designation, together with a statement of the reasons for the objection and all relevant facts, to be received by the Deputy Clerk not later than the 12th day of September, 2003. When a Notice of Objection has been received by the Municipality the matter will be referred to the Council of the Corporation of the Municipality of Grey Highlands for a hearing and report.
