TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Gravenhurst intends to designate *Gravenhurst Post Office*, located at 101 Muskoka Road North in the Town of Gravenhurst, District Municipality of Muskoka, as a structural artifact of historical interest under Part IV of *The Ontario Heritage Act* (R.S.O. 1990, Ch. O. 18). A By-law to designate the property is to be considered by Gravenhurst Town Planning Council at its regular meeting to be held at **5:00 p.m. on September 15, 2015.**

STATEMENT OF CULTURAL HERITAGE VALUE: *Gravenhurst's Post Office stands on the most prominent intersection of town, emblematic of a federal presence in the community. Built in 1926, more than three decades after the spurt of Thomas Fuller designed postal outlets which appeared across the country. A series of hotels preceded it on this lot, including Dugald Brown's Steamboat and Stage House and David Lafranier's Fraser House. A second storey featuring a clock tower angled to the crossroads was added to the building in 1935.*
