## THE ONTARIO HERITAGE ACT, STATUTES

ONTARIO, CHAPTER 337, R.S.O. 1980 and in the matter of the lands and premises known as the White/Augustine House in the former community of Malta, Lot 16, Hwy. 11, W.M.R. formerly in the Township of Morrison how in the Town of Gravenhurst." NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Gravenhurst on September 26, 1983 intends to designate the lands and buildings known as the White/Augustine House in the former community of Malta, Lot 16, Hwy. 11, W.M.R. formerly in the Township of Morrison now in the Town of Gravenhurst as a property of historical and architectural value under the provisions of the Ontario Heritage Act. Chapter 337, R.S.O. 1980 for the following reasons: 📆 🦏

The property was first settled around 1860 by Thomas White and served as the Malta Post Office from the time the village was first recognized in 1874 until the Post Office was transferred to Kilworthy in 1919.

The Augustine home and property have historical significance and the house particularly is a good example of the Gothic Revival style, better known as Ontario Gothic.

Notice of objections to the designation may be served on the Clerk within 30 days of the 17th day of August, 1983.
