TOWN OF NAPANEE

BY-LAW 770-88

A By-law to designate a certain building to be of historical significance


WHEREAS it is deemed desirable by the Council of the Town of Napanee that a certain building within the Town be designated as a building of historical significance.


NOW THEREFORE be it enacted as a by-law of the Town of Napanee by the Council thereof as follows:

- (1) That the following building in the Town of Napanee be designated as a building of historical significance.
- (2) Lot 10 South part, West of Centre St.-East part lot 10 East side Robert Street known municipally as 170 Centre Street, North.
- (3) This property was purchased by John Gibbard in 1849, and the house was constructed in the early 1850's
- (4) This frame structure has many Victorian features which indicate the early property of the Gibbard family; ornamental trim, waist high verandah rail with medallions, roof with bays on second and ground floor topped with plain gable, boxed, the end is ornamented by overlapping rows of scallops, fretwork of intertwining scrolls defines the corners.

This by-law will become effective on the date of its passing.

By-law read a first, second and third time and finally passed this 2nd day of August, 1988
