TOWN OF NAPANEE

BY-LAW 1113-96

A By-law to designate a certain building to be of Historical significance.

138 John Street Napanee Ontario

WHEREAS it is deemed desirable by the Council of the Town of Napanee that a certain building within the Town be designated as a historical significance.

WHEREAS the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990 ch. 0.18 permits Council to designate property to be of historical or architectural value or interest;

NOW THEREFORE be enacted as a by-law of the Corporation of the Town of Napanee by the Council thereof as follows:

The property hereinafter described contains a one storey brick veneer building known as 138 John Street, Napanee, Ontario, which:


- a) was constructed around 1896,
- b) is representative of office buildings built in this era,
- c) has decorative brickwork around the roofline, corners and windows,
- d) has transom sash windows with voussoir arches and stone lugsills facing John and Bridge Street,
- e) has a two panel door framed in wood and set in an arched umbrage and wood porch facing John Street,

THEREFORE the Napanee Town Council hereby designates this building to be of historical significance.

THIS by-law will become effective on the date of its passing.

THIS BY-LAW read a first, second and third time and finally passed this 25th day of March 1996.
