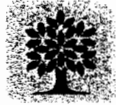
Built circa 1891, the main structure is an early example of a wood frame vernacular building clad with tongue and groove wood siding, which is a rarity within the surrounding area. The property is located within the Wortley Village/Old South Heritage Conservation District, in what is considered one of the earliest suburban areas/subdivisions within the City of London
