TOWN OF NAPANEE

BY-LAW 94-75

A By-Law to designate certain buildings to be of historical significance

WHEREAS it is deemed desirable by the Council of the Town of Napanee that certain buildings within the Town be designated as buildings of historical significance.

NOW THEREFORE, be it enacted as a by-law of the Town of Napanee by the Council thereof as follows:

(1) That the following buildings in the Town of Napanee be designated as buildings of historical significance:

(a) The Town Hall, Lots 1 2 and 3 east of Centre St. and Lots 1 2 and 3 west of John Street, known as 128 John St.

(b) Former Post Office, Lot 5 east of John Street known as 139 John Street.


(c) The County Buildings, Block 89. 37 Thomas St. East (Registry Office) 89 Thomas St. East (Social Services) 95 Thomas St. East (Museum) and 97 Thomas St. East (The Court House and County Buildings).

This By-law will become effective on the date of its passing. By-law read a first second and third time and finally passed this first day of December, 1975.
