The building located at 1656 Hyde Park Road is a two storey, brick building built in the vernacular Italianate farmhouse style circa 1880. The property is associated with the Routledge family, the founding family of Hyde Park who arrived as "Talbot Settlers" in 1818. The property's style and form is increasing rare in Hyde Park and the City, and is reflective of the rural village past of Hyde Park.
