RE: STE ANNE'S CHURCH - DEMOLITION


City Council at its meeting held on Tuesday, October, 14th, 1991 adopted by Resolution #92-451 the Minutes of the October 7th, 1991 meeting of the Heritage Sudbury Committee of the City of Sudbury.

Contained within those minutes was Committee Resolution #92-18 which recommended that Ste Anne's Parish Council be permitted to proceed with demolition, subject to four conditions. I am advised these conditions have been satisfied and it would be in order for a demolition permit to be issued by the Regional Municipality of Sudbury.

I am by copy of this letter advising Mr. Bernie Fransen, the Director of Regional Building Controls, that the City of Sudbury has no objection to the issuance of a building permit to the La Paroisse Sainte-Anne-des-Pines for the demolition of Ste Anne's Church building located at 14 Beech Street, Sudbury, Ontario. A copy of this letter is to be faxed to your contractor Mr. Murray Lacroix, Lacroix Construction Co. Ltd.

Finally, in accordance with Section 34 of the *Ontario Heritage Act* a copy of this notice will also be mailed to the Ontario Heritage Foundation and published in a newspaper having general circulation in the municipality.
