#### THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF AMHERSTBURG

#### BY-LAW NO. 2012-11

By-law to designate theproperty at 51 North Street and known as the Clement Parlette House as being of architectural and cultural heritage value or interest

WHEREAS authority was granted by Council to designate the property at 51 North Street, and known as the Clement Parlette House as being of cultural heritage value or interest; and;

WHEREAS the Ontario Heritage Act authorizes the Council of a municipality to enact By-laws to designate real property, including all the buildings and structures thereon, to be of cultural heritage value or interest; and;

WHEREAS the Council of the Town of Amherstburg has caused to be served upon the owners of the land and premises known as and upon the Ontario Heritage Trust, Notice of Intention to designate the property and has caused the Notice of Intention to be published in a newspaper having a general circulation in the municipality as required by the Ontario Heritage Act; and

WHEREAS the reasons for designation are set out in Schedule "A" to this By-law; and

WHEREAS no notice of objection to the proposed designation was served upon the Clerk of the Municipality;

**NOW THEREFORE** the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Amherstburg hereby enacts as follows:

- The property at 51 North Street, and known as the Clement Parlette House, more particularly described in Schedule "A" attached to this By-law, is designated as being of cultural heritage value or interest.
- 2. The Town Solicitor is authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be registered against the property described in Schedule "A" to this by-law in the proper Land Registry Office.
- 3. The Town Clerk is authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be served upon the owner of the property at 51 North Street., and known as the Clement Parlette House and upon the Ontario Heritage Trust and to cause notice of this by-law to be published in a newspaper having general circulation in the Town of Amherstburg as required by the *Ontario Heritage* Act.

Read a first, second and third time and finally passed this 6<sup>th</sup> day of February, 2012.



#### REASON FOR DESIGNATION OF 51 NORTH STREET, AMHERSTBURG

#### **Description of Heritage Attributes:**

51 North Street was constructed in 1873 by Clement Parlette, Carpenter. (The lot was originally owned by Arthur McKee Rankin). Another key feature of the house is in close proximity to Fort Malden.

#### Key exterior attributes that embody the heritage value of the house include:

- Single story with Gothic Revival Cottage Style which is rare for the Town of Amherstburg
- Close proximity to Fort Malden
- Pointed Arch window over the main entrance
- Transom over the front door
- Original cornice fenestration details over the front windows
- Shape and form of the original house remains intact

#### Key interior attributes that embody the heritage value of the house include:

- All interior as well as the front entrance door and brass locks are original of 1873
  - Original wood mouldings on exterior windows original of 1873
