CITY OF WATERLOO BY-LAW NUMBER 78-184

BY-LAW TO DESIGNATE THE KUNTZ HEASLEY HOUSE IN THE CITY OF WATERLO'D TO BE OF HISTORIC VALUE AND INTEREST.

W H E R E A S Section 29 of The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, authorizes Council of a municipality to designate property within the municipality to be of historic value or interest;

AND WHEREAS Council for The Corporation of the City of Waterloo deems it desirable to designate the Kuntz Heasley House to be of historic value and interest based both on its architectural significance and for its association with past leading citizens of the City of Waterloo;

A N D W H E R E A S the Clerk of the City of Waterloo has caused Notice of Intention to Designate to be given in accordance with Section 29 (3) of The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974;

AND WHEREAS no Notice of Objection has been served on the Clerk within the meaning of Section 29 (5) of The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974;

NOW THEREFORE THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF WATERLOO ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:-

- The property described in Schedule "A" attached hereto.
 is hereby designated to be of historic value and interest.
- 2. Section 33 (1) of The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, shall

apply only to the exterior elevations of the Kuntz Heasley House.

3. This By-Law shall come into effect on the final passing thereof by the Council of The Corporation of the City of Waterloo.
