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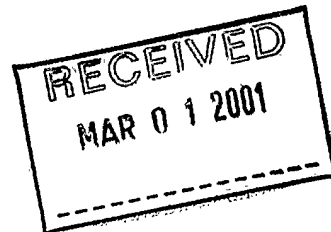

CITY OF WATERLOO**BY-LAW NO. 01-03****BY-LAW TO DESIGNATE ELAM MARTIN
FARMSTEAD, IN THE CITY OF WATERLOO, TO
BE OF HISTORIC VALUE AND INTEREST**

WHEREAS Section 29 of the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter O. 18, as amended, authorizes the Council of a municipality to designate property within the municipality to be of historic value or interest;

AND WHEREAS the Council of The Corporation of the City of Waterloo deems it desirable to designate the Elam Martin Farmstead to be of historic and architectural value and interest;

AND WHEREAS the Clerk of The Corporation of the City of Waterloo has caused Notice of Intention to Designate to be given in accordance with Section 29(3) of The Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990;

AND WHEREAS no Notice of Objection has been served on the Clerk within the meaning of Section 29(5) of The Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990;

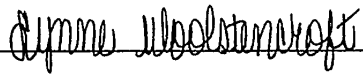
**NOW THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF
WATERLOO ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:**


1. The property described as Part of Lot 65, German Company Tract, City of Waterloo, Regional Municipality of Waterloo, designated as Part 1, 58R-12820 is hereby designated to be of historic and architectural value and interest.
2. For purposes of greater clarity, the following buildings are hereby designated to be of historic and architectural value and interest:
 - (a) Main House
 - (b) Wash House
 - (c) Doddy House
 - (d) Schnitz House
 - (e) Spring House
 - (f) Smoke House/Outhouse
 - (g) Wood/Tool Shed
 - (h) Wagon Shed
 - (i) Barn

- (j) Silo – the first silo attached to the northeast corner of the barn
- (k) Silo – the free-standing silo located to the east of the main part of the barn
- (l) Corn Crib
- (m) Drive Shed
- (n) Butchering Shed

3. This By-Law shall come into effect on the final passing thereof by the Council of The Corporation of the City of Waterloo.
