BY-LAW NO.77-187

BY-LAW TO DESIGNATE THE RUDY-SNYDER HOUSE IN THE CITY OF WATERLOO TO BE OF HISTORIC VALUE AND INTEREST.

WHEREAS Section 29 of The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974 authorizes Council of a municipality to designate property within the municipality to be of historic value or interest;

AND WHEREAS Council for The Corporation of the City of Waterloo deems it desirable to designate the Dorothy Marie Snyder house to be a historic value and interest insofar as this fieldstone house located west of Hallman Road in the southern portion of G.C.T. lot number 33, was originally built in 1847 by Daniel Rudy as noted on the half grind stone imbedded in the south wall. Other notable features are the multipaned windows, the bell and belfry, eave returns and trim, verandah and balcony, cellar entrance, board and batten summer kitchen, granite fieldstone and general exterior surfaces.

AND WHEREAS the Rudy-Snyder house, is one of the few typical Mennonite houses of Georgian architecture with a symmetrical five bay front, a doddy house, summer kitchen and woodshed. Its preservation will be invaluable to future generations as a reminder of their heritage and an example of the architecture of that period.

AND WHEREAS the Clerk of the City of Waterloo has caused Notice of Intention to Designate to be given in accordance with Section 29(3) of The Ontario Hertiage Act, 1974;

AND WHEREAS no Notice of Objection has been served on the Clerk within the meaning of Section 29(5) of The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974.

NOW THEREFORE THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF WATERLOO ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

I, Ronald C. Keeling, Clerk of the Corporation of the City of Waterloo, hereby certify this to be a true copy of By law No.777-187... of the City of Waterloo.

- The Rudy-Snyder house located on lands described in Schedule "A", attached hereto, is hereby designated to be of historic value and interest.
- 2. Section 33(1) of The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974 shall apply only to the exterior elevations of the Rudy-Snyder house and some of the exterior elevations are shown on Schedule "B", attached hereto.
- 3. This By-law shall come into effect on the final passing thereof by the Council of The Corporation of the City of Waterloo.
