## NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Kitchener intends to designate the property at the following municipal address as a property of historical and architectural value under Part IV of The Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1980, Chapter 337.

The subject property is located at 43 Benton Street and is owned by the Ontario Naturopathic Association - Ontario College of Naturopathic Medicine. It is intended that in particular, the Benton Street facade of the building, including doorways, windows and stonework will be designated.

The designation described herein is recommended on historical and architectural grounds. The building stands on the site of the birthplace of former Prime Minister William Lyon MacKenzie King. It was constructed in 1928 as a Pentecostal church, and between 1968 and 1980, it housed the K-W Art Gallery. The architect of this building was Mr. W.H.E. Schmalz who also designed the old Kitchener City Hall, and the Kitchener-Waterloo Collegiate.

Any person may, with thirty days of the first publication of this notice, send by registered mail or deliver to the Clerk of the City of Kitchener notice of his or her objection to the proposed designation together with a statement of the reasons for the objection and all relevant facts. If such a Notice of Objection is received, the Council of the Corporation of the City of Kitchener shall refer the matter to the Conservation Review Board for a hearing.
