NOTICE OF INTENTION

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Kitchener intends to designate the following municipal address(es) as being of historic and architectural significance under Part IV of the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1980, Chapter 337.

133 Graber Place  
(Harvey J. Graber Transformer Station)

The Art Deco style municipal distribution station was constructed in 1954 and named after Mr. H. Graber who served on the Public Utilities Commission for 18 years as well as the Board of Education and the Public Library Board. The station was the first of its kind to operate in the Province and identified Kitchener as one of the pioneers in the development of hydro-electric power in Ontario.

The proposed designation includes all elevations and the roof. Specific architectural features of interest include: flat roof with concrete parapet and copper cap; all tri-pane windows with metal muntins; sixteen light glass block window; brick building fabric; and the concrete door surround with inscription.

Any person may, before the 31st day of December, 1991, send by registered mail or deliver to the Clerk of the City of Kitchener notice of his or her objections to the proposed designations, together with a statement of the reasons for the objection and all relevant facts. When a Notice of Objection has been received, the Council of the Corporation of the City of Kitchener will refer the matter to the Conservation Review Board for a Hearing and report.
