(Former Toronto Dominion Bank)**

The property municipally addressed as 70 King Street East was built in 1959 as a Toronto Dominion Bank, by the bank's in-house architect Bruce Etherington. It occupies a very prominent location within Downtown Kitchener and has been identified as one of the best examples of modern movement architecture in Waterloo Region. The building was highlighted in the Kitchener-Waterloo Art Gallery catalogue publication *Images of Progress 1946-1996 Modern Architecture in Waterloo Region*, as a spirited work from the post-War period that should be a priority for preservation. In addition, the building was recommended as a priority for preservation by the jurors of the Kitchener City Hall competition in 1990.

The full particulars of the Reasons for Designation are available for inspection during normal business hours (8:30 a.m. - 5:00 p.m.) in the Office of the City Clerk, 2nd Floor, Kitchener City Hall.

Any person who objects to the proposed designation may send a Notice of Objection, together with a statement of the reasons for the objection and all relevant facts, to the Clerk of the City of Kitchener not later than the 11th day of May, 2008. Please note that when a Notice of Objection has been received, the Council of the Corporation of the City of Kitchener will refer the matter to the Conservation Review Board.
