

to designate the Christie Cemetery  
Part of Block P, Parcel P-3, Plan 66M-1391, Section M-1391  
now designated as Part 1 on Plan 66R-6632  
as being of historical and architectural value

WHEREAS the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter O.18 as amended,  
authorizes the Council of a municipality to enact by-laws to designate real property, including  
all the buildings and structures thereon, to be of historical and architectural value or interest;

AND WHEREAS the Council of The Corporation of the City of Scarborough has  
caused to be served upon the owners of the lands and premises known as the Christie Cemetery  
at property more particularly denoted in Schedule "A" hereto and upon the Ontario Heritage  
Foundation notice of intention to so designate the aforesaid real property and has caused such  
notice of intention to be published in a newspaper having a general circulation in the municipality  
once for each of three consecutive weeks;

AND WHEREAS the reasons for designation are set out in Schedule "B" hereto;

AND WHEREAS no notice of objection to the said proposed designation has been  
served upon the Clerk of the municipality;

THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF  
SCARBOROUGH ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. The real property, more particularly described in Schedule "A" hereto, known as  
the Christie Cemetery, is hereby designated as being of historical and architectural value or  
interest.

2. The City Solicitor is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be registered against the property described in Schedule "A" hereto in the proper Land Registry office.

3. The City Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be served upon the owner of the aforesaid property and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation and to cause notice of this by-law to be published in a newspaper having general circulation in the City of Scarborough.

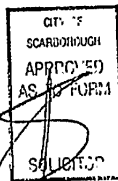

SCHEDULE "A" TO BY-LAW 24333

DESCRIPTION OF LAND

Part Block P, Plan 66M-1391, being Parcel P-3, Section 66M-1391, of the City of Scarborough in the Municipality of Metropolitan Toronto, designated as Part 1 on Reference Plan 66R-6632 deposited in the Land Titles Division of Metropolitan Toronto (No. 66).

TYPE Designation under The Ontario Heritage Act.

OWNER The Corporation of the City of Scarborough

SCHEDULE "B" TO BY-LAW 24333

REASONS FOR THE DESIGNATION OF "THE CHRISTIE CEMETERY"

The Christie Cemetery is recommended for designation for historical reasons, being one of the first Methodist cemeteries established in Scarborough. Established in 1846, the cemetery contains the interred remains of not fewer than 36 pioneers who settled in the 19th century L'Amoreaux community. While the church was dismantled and moved in 1936, most of the monuments erected on the site remained and those not free standing have been appropriately mounted in a memorial stone wall. The free standing monuments and the flat markers mounted in the wall are also included as part of the reasons for designation.
