





CITY OF TORONTO

BY-LAW No. 470-2004

**To designate the Richview Cemetery property as being of cultural heritage value
or interest.**

WHEREAS authority was granted by Council to designate the Richview Cemetery property as being of cultural heritage value or interest; and

WHEREAS the *Ontario Heritage Act* authorizes the Council of a municipality to enact by-laws to designate real property, including all the buildings and structures thereon, to be of cultural heritage value or interest; and

WHEREAS the Council of the City of Toronto has caused to be served upon the owners of the land and premises known as the Richview Cemetery and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation, Notice of Intention to designate the property and has caused the Notice of Intention to be published in a newspaper having a general circulation in the municipality as required by the *Ontario Heritage Act*; and

WHEREAS the reasons for designation are set out in Schedule "A" to this by-law; and

WHEREAS no notice of objection to the proposed designation was served upon the Clerk of the municipality;

The Council of the City of Toronto HEREBY ENACTS as follows:

1. The Richview Cemetery property, more particularly described in Schedule "B" and shown on Schedule "C" attached to this by-law, is designated as being of cultural heritage value or interest.
2. The City Solicitor is authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be registered against the property described in Schedule "B" to this by-law in the proper Land Registry Office.
3. The City Clerk is authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be served upon the owners of the Richview Cemetery property and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation and to cause notice of this by-law to be published in a newspaper having general circulation in the City of Toronto as required by the *Ontario Heritage Act*.

SCHEDULE "A"**REASONS FOR DESIGNATION**

Richview Cemetery is recommended for designation for its cultural heritage value or interest. Located on the south side of Eglinton Avenue West between the lanes of Highway No. 427, Richview Cemetery was officially opened in 1853, extended in 1886 and amalgamated with two other pioneer cemeteries in the 1970's. Richview Cemetery contains the graves of members and descendants of many of Etobicoke's founding families.

The heritage attributes of Richview Cemetery are the collection of white marble, limestone or granite monuments that encompass slab, block and obelisk styles. The McFarlane Monument is a rare example of a table style monument in an Etobicoke cemetery.


Richview Cemetery is historically and architecturally significant as an important surviving pioneer cemetery in Etobicoke.

SCHEDULE "B"

Part of Lot 16 in Concession 3 fronting the Humber designated as PART 1 on Plan 66R-20808 in the Registry Division of the Toronto Registry Office (No. 66) in the City of Toronto (formerly in the City of Etobicoke) and Province of Ontario.

The hereinbefore described land being delineated by heavy outline on Sketch No. PS-2003-070 dated May 29, 2003, as set out in Schedule "C".
