NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

TO:



ONTARIO HERITAGE FOUNDATION

Take notice that the Council of the Corporation of the Village of Paisley, on the 6th day of February 1978 decided to designate the land and building municipally known as the Custom Machine Shop; as a property of historical and architectural value or interest under the Ontario Heritage Act, 1974 S.O. Chapter 122.

SHORT STATEMENT OF THE REASONS FOR THE PROPOSED DESIGNATION

The Custom Machine Shop was built about the same time as the Town Hall. Thomas Chambers, owner for two decades was one of eight people to be granted tavern licenses by the first Village Council. The building had served as a bakery, a garage (1925) and a Lumber and Coal business (1931). In 1949 the late J. Stewart Muir took possession and created a machine shop which continues, now owned by Heinz Frederici. The overall sobriety of the building, with the early four panes of glass remaining intact, reflects its early age. Preservation of this structure is important to maintain the scale of the streetscape. The numerous adaptations which have been required of the building have served not to deface its character but rather to demonstrate its integrity.

Notice of objection to the designation may be served in writing on the Clerk within 30 days of the 22nd. day of February 1978.
