

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Township
of Woolwich intends to designate the property, including the
lands and buildings, known municipally as 38 King Street,
St. Jacobs, as a property of architectural and historical
value and interest under Part IV of the Ontario Heritage Act,
R.S.O. 1990, Chapter 0.18.

The house was built between 1856 and 1858 by John Wideman,
on property originally sold to John Bowman in 1807 from
part of the German Company holdings. George Steiner
purchased the property in 1913 [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] The house is a bold example of the
vernacular Georgian style, however the facade window treat-
ment on the first floor is most unusual and noteworthy.
Full details of the designation are available from the
Clerk's office.
