NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

TO:



ONTARIO HERITAGE FOUNDATION

Take notice that the Council of the Corporation of the Village of Paisley, on the 5th day of December 1977 decided to designate the land and building municipally known as the Gourmet Chicken House; as a property of historical and architectural value or interest under the Ontario Heritage Act. 1974 S.O. Chapter 122.

SHORT STATEMENT OF THE REASONS FOR THE PROPOSED DESIGNATION

Standing a storey above the other buildings in its row, this building was constructed for D. James Bain, Druggist and former Reeve of the Village, around the time of the railway's first connection with Paisley. The extra storey was the first meeting hall of the Aldworth (Masonic) Lodge; Bain was a charter member of the Ontario Masons. The finely worked wooden cornice and the entrance to the upper storey, a door in which the arched wooden tracery in the transom repeats the raised and moulded panels below it, are exceptional features in a handsome building.

Notice of objection to the designation may be served in writing on the Clerk within 30 days of the 18th day of January 1978.
