NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Woolwich intends to designate the property, including the lands and buildings, owned by [REDACTED] and being composed of Lots 1 to 3, 5 to 22, 24 to 26, 28 to 30, Plan 584, Township of Woolwich (formerly Township of Waterloo), located on Woolwich Township Road No. 68, as a property of architectural and historic value and interest under Part IV of the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1980, Chapter 337.

The log house located on the property was built in the 1830's and represents a style of building common in the settlement of that area. The tail of the summer kitchen attached to the log house is an interesting variation of the usual tail addition. In this case the one storey frame house has been butted, gable end, onto the rear facade of the log house. The Gore District assessment records of 1815 to 1840 for the Waterloo Township show that Daniel Burkholder and his family occupied the house on this property in 1838.

Any person may, before the 14th day of March, 1989, send by registered mail, or deliver to the Clerk of the Township, notice of his or her objection to the proposed designation, together with a statement of the reasons for the objection and all relevant facts. If a notice of objection has been received, the Council of the Township of Woolwich will refer the matter to the Conservation Review Board for a hearing and a report.
