NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

Under the Ontario Heritage Act R.S.O. 1990, c. O.18,

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of The Corporation of the Municipality of Kincardine intends to designate the property at the following municipal address as property of cultural heritage value and interest under Part IV of the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990.

PROPERTY: 618 Huron Terrace, Municipality of Kincardine ON

REASONS: Designation shall cover all exterior Georgian and Neo-Classical detailing of the structure, including all original stonework highlighting the windows and doors as well as the front door Semi-Elliptical Fan Transom and Sidelight, Monitor or Widow's Walk, and Arts and Crafts Stone Wall.

The home features a symmetrical Georgian façade with distinct Neo-Classical elements. The windows are large relative to the size of the home, typical of Neo-Classic styling, and along with the front door are classically highlighted with decorative keystones, pediments and heavy stone sills. The front door features the typical semi-elliptical fan transom and, strangely, only one sidelight. The hip roof is found in the Georgian Revival Style of architecture as is the monitor or widow's walk which was no doubt added due to the physical location of the home, on the shore of Lake Huron. The home is squared off with oversized stone quoins which contrast nicely with the yellow brick of the region. The wall surrounding the home is typical of the Arts and Crafts style of the period, no doubt built with local beach stone and may have been added after the house was complete.
