Re: Notice of Intention to Designate under The Ontario Heritage Act

This is to advise that the Council of the Township of Enniskillen passed a motion on April 16, 1985 to cause a notice of intention to designate the Imperial Oil Ltd. Oil Springs Pumping Station, located at the NW corner of Lot 17, Concession 1, Township of Enniskillen, as a property of architectural and historical value under Part IV of the Ontario Heritage Act, 1980, RSO Chapter 337.

The notice of intention to designate the property was served on the owner of land and was published in a newspaper having general circulation in the municipality, once for each of three consecutive weeks, and no objections were received within the 30 day objection period. I have included a copy of the Notice that was published in the local newpaper for your interest. The Township Council will subsequently pass a By-law designating the property and a copy of the By-law will be forwarded to your office in due course.

Take Notice that the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Enniskillen intends to designate the property, including lands and buildings, at the following municipal address as a property of architectural and historial value or interest under Part IV of the Ontario Heritage Act. 1980, R.S.O. Chapter 337.

a) Municipal Address: Imperial Oil Ltd. Oil Springs Pumping Station located at the NW Corner of Lot 17, Conc. 1, Township of Enniskillen

Reasons for Proposed Designation:

Historical Reas

The Imperial Oil Limited Oil Spr ings Pumping Station is the last remaining structure on site of approximately ten such stations built to receive oil from the Oli Springs and Petrolia fields and transport it via rail and pipeline to refineries at Petrolla and Sar-

It was established in 1915 by It was established in 1915 by certain Oil Springs oil producers weary of the monoploy on the transport of crude then held by the Canadian Oil Producing and the Canadian oil Producing and Refining Company, an English concern. One of the founding producers. J.H. Fairbank Estate, provided the land to im-perial oil. The producers also negotiated with the New York Central Railway for a siding and loading rack. Imperial oil excavated an underground receiv-ing tank from which the crude was lifted by steam powered pumps to an elevated tank from which it descended into the rallway's tank cars.

Eventually Ontario Hydro arrived at Oil Springs and an electric motor supplanted the steam pump. The primary receiver & pumping station continued with periodic interruptions until October, 1955 when Imperial Oli decided local receiving and pump stations, including those at Petrolla and Bothwell, had outlived their usefuliness and closed at local stations.

The local producers, however, accepted the station from imaccepted the station from Imperial and continued to employ it co-operatively. Imperial Oil contributed \$100 a month toward the operating costs and the late Charles/Fairbank, Petrolla, was

the volunteer supervisor.

Ultimate imperia un become unable lo subsidize the costs of the stallon and notified producers that it would be closed.

Ny 1972 most producers bad 1972, most producers had installed tankage in their fleids and were able to ship directly to the relinery by tank truck. The the refinery by tank truck. The fast shipment from the Oil Spr-ings stations was in July, 1973 and the station was closed in August of that year.

Architectural Reasons:

The building is typical of industrial construction in the area and of the period, being wood, board and batten and having an earthen floor. An interesting installation is the water collection system for the steam pumps. Roof water ran from the eavestroughing down a long pipe to an underground tank. The building is in a rustic setting, characteristic of the Oli Springs fields, and picturesque partly because most other structures of its type have long since disappeared and there

Notice to **Rural Landowers**

Please be advised of Section 80 of the Drainage Act which states that when a drainage works becomes obstructed by a washing out of private drain for which the owner of the land adjoining the drainage works is responsible so that the free flow of water is impeded thereby, the persons owning the land shall, upon reasonable notice given by the Council of the local municipality whose duty it is to maintain and repair the drainage works, remove such obstructions, and, if it is not so removed, the Council or the Drainage Superinten-tent shall forthwith cause it to be removed, and the cost is payable to the municipality by the owner of the land.

The Council of the Township of Brooke trusts that landowners will co-operate to ensure that all surface and sub-surface drains are properly rip-rapped and a grass berm strip is left adjacent to open ditches instead of working up to the ditch bank to prevent costly wash-ins in municipal ditches.
