

There were no objection to this designation. The cemetery in question is owned by the Municipality.

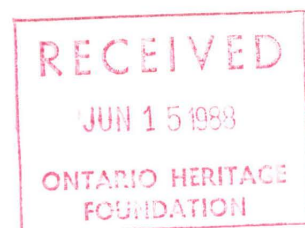

## NOTICE

### Designation of properties being of historical interest

The Municipal Council of the Town of Hearst has read a first and second time, by-law No. 65-87, designating the two cemeteries in the Town of Hearst to be of historical value;

#### 1. Mgr Pierre Grenier Cemetery

Part of the south part of lot 1, Concession 10, way Township: Parcel 802 Centre Cochrane.

The land for this cemetery was purchased in January 1925 by the Roman Catholic Episcopal Corporation for the Diocese of Hearst. It became a public cemetery in 1976 and ownership was transferred to the municipality in 1981. A central monument was erected in the cemetery in June of 1952. It was named "Monseigneur Pierre Grenier Cemetery" by the Hearst Cemeteries Board in 1985.

#### 2. Riverside Cemetery

Part of the unsubdivided portion of the Town of Hearst, being part of lot 24, concession 10, Kendall Township; Parcel 724 Centre Cochrane.

This land by vertu of Patent "A" 3545 became the property of the Municipality, to be used as a public cemetery, in June 1923. It was named Riverside Cemetery by the Hearst Cemeteries Board in 1985.

Notice of objection to these designations may be served on the Clerk, within 30 days of the 23rd day of October 1987, at Town Hall, 925 Alexandra St., Hearst, Ontario.
