NOTICE

RESIDENTS OF PAISLEY THE MILNE HOUSE INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

...The Milne House ([REDACTED] George Street) is recommended for designation for historical significance to the Village, as the childhood and adolescent home of the Canadian Artist, David Brown Milne.

The brick bond, polychroming, and the iron cresting, give the 1890 house its distinctive architectural quality, reflected in the materials and construction of an outbuilding. The whole is set in a landscape of a whimsical Victorian charm. Rock gardens including tiny footpaths, steps and a pool, line the bank of the Willow Creek at the western edge of the property. A terraced lawn displaying ornaments decorated with mosaics of carefully sorted feldspar chips, also gives the place a special stamp—somewhat exotic, and suggestive of a compulsion to organize the wilderness.

Notice of objection to the designation may be served in writing, on the Clerk, within 30-days of the 22nd day of April, 1981.
