

I hereby certify that the Municipal Council, at its session held on December 3, 1990, resolved:

8. That, on the recommendation of the Local Architectural Conservation Advisory Committee, notice of Council's intention to designate the property at 148 Sydenham Street to be architectural value or interest be given for the following reasons under the provisions of Section 29(3) of the Ontario Heritage Act, Chapter 337. The owner concurred in the above recommendation on the understanding that the land to be included in the designation will be as shown on the assessment roll.

## Architectural Reasons

The Ontario Cottage at 148 Sydenham Street was built in c. 1869. It is a good example of a well-proportioned one storey, white brick Ontario cottage. The façade is symmetrical, distinguished by its peaked central gable and attractive later doorway with wood pilasters, entablature and transom. The windows are framed by brick voussoirs and shutters. The front façade is framed by brick corner pilasters and cornice. The roof may have been originally wood shingle. (35.1.1)(8/28/PC)
