By-law No. L.S.P.-3158-261

A by-law to designate 332 St. George Street to be of historical and architectural value.

WHEREAS pursuant to <u>The Ontario Heritage Act</u>, R.S.O. 1990, c. 0.18, the Council of a municipality may by by-law designate a property including buildings and structures thereon to be of historic or architectural value or interest;

AND WHEREAS notice of intention to so designate the property known as 332 St. George Street has been duly published and served and no notice of objection to such designation has been received;

The Municipal Council of The Corporation of the City of London enacts as follows:

- 1. There is designated as being of historical and architectural value or interest, the real property at 332 St. George Street, more particularly described in Schedule "A" hereto, for the reasons set out in Schedule "B" hereto.
- 2. The City Clerk is authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be registered upon the title to the property described in Schedule "A" hereto in the proper Land Registry Office.
- 3. The City Clerk is authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be served upon the owner of the aforesaid property and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation and to cause notice of this by-law to be published in the London Free Press, and to enter the description of the aforesaid property, the name and address of its registered owner, and short reasons for its designation in the Register of all properties designated under The Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990.
- 4. This by-law comes into force on the day it is passed.

SCHEDULE "A"

To By-law No. L.S.P.-3158-261

All and Singular that certain parcel or tract of land and premises situate lying and being in the City of London, in the County of Middlesex and being composed of Part of Lot 29 according to Registered Plan Number 218, more particularly described as follows:

Commencing at the northwest angle of said Lot 29 (being the easterly limit of St. George Street);

Thence southerly along the westerly limit of said Lot 29, Forty Feet (40') to a point;

Thence easterly parallel with the northerly limit of said Lot 29, One Hundred Thirty Feet (130') more or less to the easterly limit of said Lot 29;

Thence northerly along the easterly limit of said Lot 29, Forty Feet (40') more or less to the northeast tangle of said Lot 29;

Thence westerly along the northerly limit of said Lot 29, One Hundred Thirty Feet (130') more or less to the place of beginning.

Historical Reasons

City Directory records indicate that this property was originally occupied from its construction in 1896 to the mid 1940's by William McLoud who was High Constable for the County of Middlesex.

Architectural Reasons

This yellow brick Queen Anne style house at 332 St. George Street was built in 1896. Exterior architectural features of note include a hip roof with front and side gables which contain decorative bargeboards, pediments and brackets, and a projecting bay window on the north side of the building. There is also attractive beading detail at the base of the front gable, and voussoirs above all windows. The front doors have decorative sidelights and a multiple light transom. There is also a multiple light transom over the large front window.

Interior features of note include the double parlour and living room which have eleven and a half foot ceilings, high baseboards and white oak hardwood floors. The fireplace located in the living room appears to have been a later addition.

Contextual Reasons

This property is located in an area which has a high concentration of heritage buildings. The varied housing styles exemplifies the income mix and occupations of individuals in this neighbourhood.
