By-law No. L.S.P.-3159-262

A by-law to designate 437 Victoria Street to be of architectural value.

WHEREAS pursuant to <u>The Ontario Heritage Act</u>, R.S.O. 1990, c. 0.18, the Council of a municipality may by by-law designate a property including buildings and structures thereon to be of historic or architectural value or interest;

AND WHEREAS notice of intention to so designate the property known as 437 Victoria Street has been duly published and served and no notice of objection to such designation has been received;

The Municipal Council of The Corporation of the City of London enacts as follows:

- 1. There is designated as being of architectural value or interest, the real property at 437 Victoria Street, more particularly described in Schedule "A" hereto, for the reasons set out in Schedule "B" hereto.
- 2. The City Clerk is authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be registered upon the title to the property described in Schedule "A" hereto in the proper Land Registry Office.
- 3. The City Clerk is authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be served upon the owner of the aforesaid property and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation and to cause notice of this by-law to be published in the London Free Press, and to enter the description of the aforesaid property, the name and address of its registered owner, and short reasons for its designation in the Register of all properties designated under The Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990.
- 4. This by-law comes into force on the day it is passed.

SCHEDULE "A"

To By-law No. L.S.P.-3159-262

Part of Lot 37 east side of Colborne Street, City of London, County of Middlesex more particularly described below:

Commencing at a point in the northerly boundary of the said Lot, one hundred and eighty-six feet, eleven inches easterly from the north west angle of the said lot;

Thence easterly along the northerly boundary of the said lot, forty feet;

Thence southerly parallel with the easterly boundary thereof, one hundred and thirty-tow feet more or less to the southerly boundary thereof;

Thence westerly along the southerly boundary forty feet;

Thence northerly parallel with the westerly boundary one hundred and thirty-two feet to the place of the beginning.

SCHEDULE "B"

Architectural Reasons

The Arts and Crafts bungalow has the low pitched gabled roof and exposed structural elements that are indicative of this style. Built in 1925 this stucco and brick house contains many fine architectural features. The projecting decorative beams on the front facade, the decorative purlins, combined with the simplicity of the stucco, give the house a stark quality. The facade suggests California influence. Tripartite windows with their original storms adorn the facade of the building. The original front porch features tongue and groove flooring and brick piers. There if also an original stained glass lantern lighting the front entrance. Fire insurance records indicate that the original roof material was composed of tar and gravel.

The garage located at the rear of the property has been constructed in the Tudor style of architecture with half timbering and stucco.
