I hereby certify that the Municipal Council, at its session held on December 16, 1991 resolved:

19. That, on the recommendation of the Local Architectural Conservation Advisory Committee, notice of Council's intention to designate the property at **839 Queens Avenue** to be of architectural value or interest **BE GIVEN** for the following reasons under the provisions of Section 29(3) of the Ontario Heritage Act, Chapter 337. The owners concurred in the above recommendation on the understanding that the land to be included in the designation will be as shown on the assessment roll.

## Architectural Reasons

The two storey Queen Anne house at **839 Queens Avenue** was built c. 1881. It is notable for its elaborate woodwork, particularly the stencil cut semicircular vergeboard fretwork. The double window on the front façade has semicircular arches with an eared window surround. Under the eaves are double brackets attached to a panelled and carved frieze. The front single storey bay window has a truncated hip roof with bracketing, segmental arch and eared surrounds of the windows. The recessed entrance glazed double doors have carved panelling and rounded corners. The entrance porch features decorative friezework and bracketing. The house has a brick foundation. The original exterior material was tongue and groove wood siding. (35.1.1)(19/1/PC)
