your information a copy of the by-law is attached.

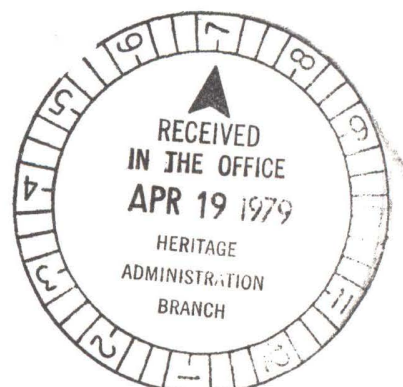

CORPORATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF
RAMSAY

BY-LAW NUMBER 1554

A BY-LAW to designate the property known municipally as S.S. # 11, Schoolhouse, Pt. Lt 4, Conc. 10, Township of Ramsay, as being of Architectural and Historical Value or Interest.

WHEREAS section 29 of The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974 authorizes the Council of a municipality to enact by-laws to designate real property, including all buildings and structures thereon, to be of architectural or historic value or interest; and

WHEREAS the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Ramsay has caused to be served on the owners of the lands and premises known as S.S. # 11, Schoolhouse, Township of Ramsay, and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation, notice of intention to so designate the aforesaid real property and has caused such notice of intention to be published in the same newspaper having general circulation in the municipality once for each of three consecutive weeks; and

WHEREAS no notice of objection to the proposed designation has been served on the clerk of the municipality;

THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Ramsay enacts as follows:

- 1) There is designated as being of architectural and historical value or interest the real property known as the S.S. # 11 Schoolhouse and the land upon which it is situate being more particularly described as follows:

All that part of the East Half of Lot number 4 in the Tenth Concession of the Township of Ramsay more particularly described as follows:

COMMENCING on the South Easterly angle of said half lot;

THENCE proceeding on a course North, thirty six degrees West following the Easterly side of said half lot 240 feet (80 yards) to a post;

THENCE South, fifty four degrees West 181.5 feet (60½ yards) to a post;


THENCE South thirty six degrees East, 240 feet (80 yards) more or less to the Southerly boundary of said half lot;


THENCE North fifty-four degrees East and following the Southerly boundary of said half lot 181.5 feet (60½ yards) more or less to the place of beginning.
The foregoing being the lands described in Registered Instrument number 1737.

2) The municipal solicitor is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be registered against the property described in the proper land Registry Office.


3) The Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be served on the owner of the aforesaid property and on the Ontario Heritage Foundation and to cause notice of the passing of this by-law to be published in the same newspaper having general circulation in the municipality once for each of three consecutive weeks.

READ A FIRST, SECOND AND THIRD TIME AND PASSED THIS 4th day of April, 1979.
