*The by-law to be considered by Council on December 8, 1976 should reflect this change.

1. That in view of the apparent alterations in 1875 to the foundation of the Hiron's House, at which time the Station Street wall appears to have been reworked and rebuilt in brick with a limestone outer facing; and because of further damage to the surviving foundation in October 1975, that Council withdraw its "Notice of Intention to Designate" the limestone walls believed to be the foundation of Hiron's House established in 1838.


