



NOTICE OF INTENT TO DESIGNATE

TAKE NOTICE THAT the Council of the Town of Lindsay hereby gives Notice of Intent to Designate the building at 21 Francis Street, Lindsay, as a building of historical and architectural value or interest under the provisions of the Ontario Heritage Act.

THE REASONS FOR DESIGNATION ARE:

An example of Queen Anne Revival style of architecture, built about 1900, is irregular in outline with a broad wrap-around veranda. The house is of red brick and stone foundation. The building is an important feature of the historic streetscape and is deserving of protection.

ANY NOTICE OF OBJECTION with reasons, to this designation may be served on the Clerk within thirty (30) days of February 6th, 1989, being the date of first publication of this notice.
