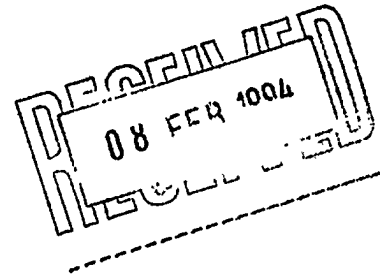

**NOTICE OF INTENTION TO AMEND A HERITAGE DESIGNATION
(329 ST. GEORGE STREET - "THORNWOOD")**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of The Corporation of the City of London is proposing to pass a by-law to amend the heritage designation placed on the property at 329 St. George Street ("Thornwood") under the provisions of the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990, c.018 and By-law No. L.S.P.-3149-194 passed on July 6, 1992.

The purpose of the proposed amending by-law is to repeal that part of By-law No. L.S.P.-3149-194 relating to the land component and to permit the alteration of the east end of the manor house for the purpose of constructing an addition. The detailed reasons for the original designation of this property can be seen in or obtained from the Office of the City Clerk, Room 308, City Hall, 300 Dufferin Avenue, London, Ontario N6A 4L9 during normal office hours (8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday to Friday). Any person who objects to this proposed change in the designation must, by no later than March 7, 1994, serve on the City Clerk, a notice of objection in writing, setting out the reason for the objection and all relevant facts. The Ontario Heritage Act provides that where a notice of objection has been served, the Council shall refer the matter to the Conservation Review Board for a hearing.
