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



By-law No. L.S.P.-3251-30

A by-law to designate 430 Dufferin Avenue to be of architectural and contextual value.

WHEREAS pursuant to the *Ontario Heritage Act*, R.S.O. 1990, c. 0.18, the Council of a municipality may by by-law designate a property including buildings and structures thereon to be of historic or architectural value or interest;

AND WHEREAS notice of intention to so designate the property known as 430 Dufferin Avenue has been duly published and served and no notice of objection to such designation has been received;

The Municipal Council of The Corporation of the City of London enacts as follows:

- 1. There is designated as being of architectural and contextual value or interest, the real property at 430 Dufferin Avenue, more particularly described in Schedule "A" hereto, for the reasons set out in Schedule "B" hereto.
- 2. The City Clerk is authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be registered upon the title to the property described in Schedule "A" hereto in the proper Land Registry Office.
- 3. The City Clerk is authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be served upon the owner of the aforesaid property and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation and to cause notice of this by-law to be published in the London Free Press, and to enter the description of the aforesaid property, the name and address of its registered owner, and short reasons for its designation in the Register of all properties designated under the *Ontario Heritage Act.*, R.S.O. 1990.
- 4. This by-law comes into force on the day it is passed.

Architectural Reasons

Built c.1875 this two storey, four bay vernacular townhouse retains many of its original features. These characteristics include the parapet walls, arched windows with voussoirs, and galleries at the rear. Nonetheless there have been substantive alterations over the years. For example, door placement on the front facade was originally on westernmost bay. The centre gable with decorative wood trim, the cornice and the round-headed dormers are later additions, as are the shutters. The brick has been painted. The original roof material was probably wood shingle.

Contextual Reasons

430 Dufferin Avenue is situated at a unique location where Cartwright and Dufferin intersect. Here 430 and 434 Dufferin and 2-4 Cartwright define a small green space due to the width of the street boulevard. Here the street grid shifts slightly south, marking one period of development from another. In the past, it was a popular location for neighbourhood baseball games.
