NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Town of Orangeville intends to designate the building including lands on the premises located on Lots 1, 2, 3, Part of Lot 4, Plan 49, as in OR8222 T/W OR8222, municipally known as 144 Broadway (The Orangeville Public Library), in the Town of Orangeville, in the County of Dufferin, in the Province of Ontario.

REASONS FOR PROPOSED DESIGNATION

The subject buildings known as the Orangeville Public Library represent three important architectural facades in the downtown core. The building known as the Orangeville Public Library encompasses the former Carnegie Library and Royal Bank buildings together with an addition constructed in the 1980's. As the library faces the possibility of expansion it is important that these facades are protected.
