

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Town of Orangeville intends to designate the building including lands on the premises located on Part of Lots 7 and 8, Block 9, Registered Plan 138, municipally known as 260-262 Broadway, in the Town of Orangeville, in the County of Dufferin, in the Province of Ontario.

REASONS FOR PROPOSED DESIGNATION

This property is part of the original Orange Lawrence parcel that was subdivided in 1851. The 1861 census indicates that the building was constructed in 1859 by Guy Leslie. The home is one of the only few built in the Regency Villa style in Orangeville. The significant features of this building are; a strongly symmetrical façade with an equal balance of windows around a central doorway, a low pitched hipped roof combined with dentil moulding on the cornice, and a full length verandah. To indicate its' pre-eminence, the house was widely known as Castle Leslie.
