

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Town of Orangeville intends to designate the building and land located on Part Lot 1, Concession 3, W.H.S., being Part 1 on Reference Plan 7R-1171, municipally known as 489 Broadway (The Perfect House), in the Town of Orangeville, in the County of Dufferin, in the Province of Ontario.

REASONS FOR PROPOSED DESIGNATION

The subject building known as "The Perfect House" is the oldest structure in the vicinity and its presence reflects historical land use in the area. It is a tangible connection to the past community of Springbrook.

The building, which was constructed in 1877 served as an inn and was known as the Perfect House, after its proprietors Robert and Elizabeth Perfect. Although there are several late 20th century additions to the structure, the bones of the 19th century inn are still visible and what remains is largely in original condition.

Notice of Objection to the designation may be served on the Clerk within 30 days of the date of this publication.
