### NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Town of Orangeville intends to designate, under Part IV of the *Ontario Heritage Act* the building and lands described as Part of Lot 22, block 8, Plan 138, municipally known as 20 York Street, in the Town of Orangeville, in the County of Dufferin, in the Province of Ontario.

### REASONS FOR PROPOSED DESIGNATION

The house was built by John Rowan in 1894. It features a vernacular amalgamation of style elements showing Italianate and Queen Anne influences. The Italianate style was popular between 1850-1900 while the Queen Ann style was popular between 1880-1910. The two storey red brick house features an Italianate protruding frontispiece with a gable. The arch topped windows with brick keystones, end-on voussoirs, rusticated stone sills and transoms are strong elements. One of the more notable features is the irregularity of the plan. The front door appears to be original with a turn bell and window and a small arched transom. The irregular roof line and decorative bargeboards show a Queen Anne influence.
