





BY-LAW NUMBER 6-2005

**A BY-LAW TO AMEND BY-LAW 112-2004,
BEING A BY-LAW TO DESIGNATE THE PROPERTY
SITUATED AT 260-262 BROADWAY, AS BEING
OF ARCHITECTURAL AND HISTORICAL
SIGNIFICANCE.**

**(Part of Lot 7, Block 9, Registered Plan 138, Part 1
Reference Plan 7R-4708)**

WHEREAS By-law 112-2004 was passed in accordance with Section 29 of the *Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O., 1990* authorizes the Council of a municipality to enact by-laws to designate real property, including all buildings and structures thereon, to be of architectural or historic value or interest;

AND WHEREAS it was discovered upon registration that there was a discrepancy in the legal description of the property;


THEREFORE BE IT ENACTED by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Town of Orangeville as follows:

1. That the legal description of By-law 112-2004 be amended to read as follows:

"Part of Lot 7, Block 9, Registered Plan 138, Part 1, Reference Plan 7R-4708"

READ THREE TIMES AND FINALLY PASSED IN OPEN COUNCIL THIS 17TH DAY OF JANUARY, 2005.
