BEING A BY-LAW TO DESIGNATE PROPERTIES OF ARCHITECTURAL AND HISTORICAL VALUE OR INTEREST UNDER PART IV OF THE ONTARIO HERITAGE ACT, 1974, S. O. CHAPTER 122.

WHEREAS notice of intention to pass this By-law was published for three (3) consecutive weeks in the Gananogue Reporter and the Brockville Recorder and Times newspapers, having general circulation in the Township of Front of Escott.

AND WHEREAS no objection to the designation has been served upon the Clerk of the Township of Front of Escott.

NOW THEREFORE, be it enacted as a By-law of the Corporation of the Township of Front of Escott as follows:

That the following parcels of land and buildings be designated under the Ontario Heritage Act, as properties of architectural and historical value or interest; more particularly described in Schedule A hereto:

- (a) SPRINGFIELD HOUSE, as known in earlier times, located west of the Township Hall on Lot 17, Concession 2.
- (b) TOWNSHIP HALL, located on Lot 17, Concession 2, in the hamlet of Escott.

SCHEDULE A TO BY-LAW #711

- (a) SPRINGFIELD HOUSE, as known in earlier times, located west of the Township Hall on Lot 17, Concession 2.

The reason for the proposed designation is to preserve a structure of historic and architectural value, having been built about 1850 as a residence and later used as a wayside inn for the accomodation of overnight travellers. The building was built of area stone, and the scale and proportions are excellent. The projected use in the future to be as a Public Library and museum rooms.

The location of the building in the hamlet of Escott is in close proximity to the Public School and Township premises lends to continuing growth in the Community.

The following property is described as:

ALL and singular that certain parcel or tract of land and premises, situate, lying and being in the Township of Escott and County of Leeds being composed of part of Lot Number Seventeen (17) in the Second Concession of the said Township, which said parcel may be more particularly described by a description compiled by R. F. Mucklestone, Ontario Land Surveyor, described in instrument number 111313 safe and except that portion of Lot 17, in the 2nd Concession of the said Township, designated as Part 2 on a Reference Plan as deposited in the Land Registry Office for the Registry Division of the County of Leeds.

- (b) TOWNSHIP HALL, located on Lot 17, Concession 2, in the hamlet of Escott.

The reason for the proposed designation is to preserve a solid brick structure of historical value.

Now used as the Township Community Hall and Township Offices, originally built in 1871 to house the Township Hall and the second storey built and used by the Macey Lodge, which later joined the Lodge at Mallorytown.

The following property described as:

ALL and Singular, that certain parcel or tract of land, lying and being in the Township of Escott in the County of Leeds and Province of Ontario, being composed of a part of Lot number seventeen (17) in the Second Concession of the said Township of Escott, as described in instrument number 101 as deposited on December 12, 1871, in the Land Registry Office for the Registry Division of the County of Leeds.
