By-Law Number 95-25

A BY-LAW TO DESIGNATE THE PROPERTY KNOWN MUNICIPALLY AS THE LARUE CEMETERY, LOT 22, CONCESSION BROKEN FRONT, TOWNSHIP OF FRONT OF ESCOTT, AS BEING OF HISTORICAL VALUE OR INTEREST.

WHEREAS Part IV of the Ontario Heritage Act, Chapter 0.18, R.S.O. 1990, authorizes the Council of a Municipality to enact By-Laws to designate real property, including all buildings and structures thereon, to be of architectural or historical value or interest;

WHEREAS the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Front of Escott has caused to be served on the owners of the lands and premises known as the LaRue Cemetery, Lot 22, Concession Broken Front, Township of Front of Escott, and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation, notice of intention to so designate the aforesaid real property and has caused such notice of intention to be published in the same newspaper having general circulation in the municipality once for each of three consecutive weeks; and,

WHEREAS no notice of objection to the proposed designation has been served on the Clerk of the Municipality;

NOW THEREFORE, the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Front of Escott enacts as follows:

- There is designated as being of historical value or interest the real property known as the LaRue Cemetery, Lot 22, Concession Broken Front, Township of Front of Escott, more particularly described in Schedule "A" attached hereto.
- A copy of this By-Law is to be registered against the property described in (2) Schedule "A" attached hereto in the proper Land Registry Office.
- The Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this By-Law to be served (3) on the Owner of the aforesaid property and on the Ontario Heritage Foundation and to cause notice of the passing of this By-Law to be published in the same newspaper having general circulation in the Municipality once for each of three consecutive weeks.

This By-law shall come into force and take effect on the date of its passing.

READ a FIRST and SECOND Time this 18th day of December, 1995.

READ a THIRD Time and FINALLY PASSED THIS 18th day of December, 1995.

REGARDING LARUE CEMETERY ON LOT 22, BROKEN FRONT

REASONS FOR DESIGNATION

- 1. Oldest Pioneer Cemetery in Township
 This is the resting place of William LaRue, his wife Abigail Hagerman, a United Empire
 Loyalist, and many of their children. Billa LaRue was one of Front of Escott's most
 prosperous settlers and millers, having come to the area in 1790. The LaRues lived
 and worked on this property adjacent to the burial ground during the early years of
 the 19th century. One by one, six of the children died before they were grown. The
 oldest grave is that of their son Joseph, who died in 1804 at the age of four. One
 daughter, Sarah, inherited the mills and most of the land after her father's death
 in 1832. It was she who arranged for her parents' tombs with a flatteirng memorial
 on her father's stone. The gravestones of the parents are fine examples of markers
 of the well-to-do and contrast with the simpler stones of the children from an earlier
 period.
- A Recognized Landmark
 The Larue family cemetery is a recognized landmark on the Thousand Islands Parkway, attracting the attention of hundreds of tourists annually. Protecting the gravestones by heritage designation reflects the township's respect for its pioneers.
