The Ballydulf Presbyterian Church is being recommended for designation on the basis of its architectural value as an example of early colonial gollhic style. The property is also regarded as a local landmark as it was constructed by members of the community.

The Cambridge Street Baptist Church, 28 Cambridge Street North, Lindsay

#### Description of the Heritage Attributes of the Property:

The Cambridge Street Baptist Church is being recommended for designation on the basis of its architectural value as a rare example of Gothic and Upper Canada style architecture with a bell spire topped by orbs that examplify Gothic architecture from that era. The property is also regarded as a landmark church with a bell tower that was Lindsay's first clock tower. It also has local historical significance as the 1872 Bible Christian Church that was sold to the First Baptist Church in 1885.
