A BY LAW to designate the Stephen Mirick House Lot 24 Plan 6, Brock South Side, East of St Lawrence Street of Architectural and Historic Value.

WHEREAS The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, authorizes The Council of a Municipality to enact By Laws to designate Real Property including all the buildings and structures thereon, to be of historic or architectural value or interest, and Whereas notice of intention to so designate the Stephen Mirick House Lot 24, Plan 6 Brock St., East of St. Lawrence Street, having been duly published and served and no notice of objection to such designation having been received and, whereas the reasons for the designation are set out as schedule 'B' Hereto;

Therefore The Council of The Village of Merrickville enacts as follows:

1. There is designated as being of Architectural and Historic value or interest The Real Property, more particularly described in Schedule 'A' hereto, known as The Stephen Mirick, Lot 24 Plan 6 Brock Street, South side East of St. Lawrence Street.
2. The Village Solicitor is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this By Law to be registered against the property described in schedule 'A' hereto in the proper Land Registry Office.
3. The Village Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this By-Law to be served upon the owner of the aforesaid property and upon The Ontario Heritage Foundation and to cause notice of This By Law to be published in The Merrickville Chronicle.

Reasons for designation under The Ontario Heritage Act 1974:

" The Stephen Mirick House is unique amongst the stone houses in Merrickville. Now owned by [REDACTED] it is built in a style which borrows from the Greek, with its classical porch, the entablature of which is mirrored along the top of the ashlar stone facade, with its pilasters in relief at the corners. The scale of the five bay facade with its large windows, evokes a feeling of grandeur not obtained from the overall size of the building. Sitting, as it does, on a tree lined street, it is indeed a cool, quiet and picturesque scene, just off St. Lawrence St. Having been built around 1850, this house was the home of the son of the founder of Merrickville, a local business and landowner. This fact, combined with its unique stone work, renders it worthy of designation."
