BY-LAW NUMBER 156-1998

A BY-LAW TO DESIGNATE THE LANDS AND PREMISES SITUATE WITHIN THE CITY OF WINDSOR, KNOWN AS THE ROBERT GORDON HOUSE, 204 CURRY STREET, IN THE CITY OF WINDSOR, TO BE OF ARCHITECTURAL AND/OR HISTORIC VALUE OR INTEREST UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THE ONTARIO HERITAGE ACT, R.S.O. 1990, CHAPTER O.18, AS AMENDED

Passed the 19th day of May, 1998.

WHEREAS by virtue of the provisions of the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter O.18, as amended, the Council of a municipality may, by by-law, designate a property within the municipality to be of historic or architectural value or interest;

AND WHEREAS upon consideration of the recommendation of the Windsor Architectural Conservation Advisory Committee, The Corporation of the City of Windsor deems it desirable and expedient to designate Lot 22 and part of closed alley, Registered Plan 245, municipally known as 204 Curry Avenue, Windsor, to be of historic or architectural value or interest, for the reasons stated in Schedule "A" annexed hereto and forming part of this by-law;

AND WHEREAS notice of intention to so designate the subject property was served on the owner(s) of the subject property and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation, and such notice was published in a newspaper having general circulation in the municipality once a week for three consecutive weeks:

AND WHEREAS no notice of objection was served on the Clerk of the Corporation.

THEREFORE the Council of The Corporation of the City of Windsor enacts as follows:

- 1. That the above defined subject property be and the same is hereby designated to be of architectural and/or historic value or interest.
- 2. That this by-law shall come into force and effect after the final passing thereof on the day upon which if is registered in the Land Registry Office for Essex (No. 12).

REASONS FOR DESIGNATION

Robert Gordon House, 204 Curry Street, Windsor

Historical

A single-family dwelling representative of a type of house popular in Windsor in the early decade of this century.

Artchitectural

A typical Edwardian frame cottage, built C. 1910.

A front-gabled dwelling with wooden fish-scale shingles, wooden front porch with latheturned columns and sawn ornaments, coloured leaded-glass transom window in the front bay window situated on a large well-treed lot with rear garden.
